

Spiritual Maturity

1. What is spiritual maturity?

Spiritual maturity is becoming more like Jesus Christ. After salvation, every Christian begins the process of spiritual growth, with the intent to become spiritually mature.

- > Spiritual maturity is an ongoing process that will never end in this life. Philippians 3.10," That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death
- Spiritual maturity is putting importance on living holy.
- Spiritual maturity is reflecting our relationship with God.
- Spiritual maturity is growing in wisdom, knowledge and understanding



If we are not maturing in our relationship with God, we cannot bear fruit of the Spirit.

2. How can I become more spiritually mature?

Spiritual maturity requires reordering of one's priorities, changing over from pleasing self to pleasing God and learning to obey God

- > The spiritually mature Christian is one who is growing in his grasp of truth
- > The spiritually mature Christian knows who he is and where he is going.
- > The spiritually mature Christian has A positive self-concept consistent with biblical teaching about humility.
- > The spiritually mature Christian must understand that true spiritual maturity involves the adequate and efficient handling of stress
- The Spiritually Mature Christian will bear maximum fruit. .

3. Why Is Spiritual Maturity Important?

The most important reason to mature spiritually would be for our lives to reflect the nature of Jesus Christ
