"And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth." John 1.14

"The Word" (Logos) in John 1 is referring to Jesus. Jesus is the total Message—everything that God wants to communicate to man

➤ God is Holy, Eternal, Sovereign, Immutable, Omnipotent, Love

The Greeks used the word *logos* to refer to one's "mind," "reason," or "wisdom."

- John used this Greek concept to communicate the fact that Jesus, the Second Person of the Trinity, is the self-expression of God to the world.
- In the Old Testament, the word of God brought the universe into existence (Psalm 33:6) and saved the needy (Psalm 107:20).
- In chapter 1 of his Gospel, John is appealing to both Jew and Gentile to receive the eternal Christ.
